**DOC TROUTMAN
RITES WILL BE
HELD AT TEMPLE**

**Born in Brookville
He Came Here in 1919
As a World War Vet**

As employee of the Westerville Creamery Co., for the past 17 and a half years, Allen Leslie "Doc" Troutman, died Wednesday at his home, 161 East College Avenue, following a short illness. Funeral services will be held at 3:30 p.m., Friday at the Westerville Masonic Temple, with Rev. Mallard J. Miller of the United Brethren church in charge, assisted by Rev D. W. Cryer. Friends may call at the residence until time of services.

A native of Brookville, Ohio, Mr. Troutman came to Westerville in the fall of 1919, after his discharge in June that year from World War I, and entered Otterbein College. He graduated in the class of 1923 then continued to make his home here.

He was a 32nd degree Mason and held membership in the Shrine, the Eastern Star, American Legion Young Budd Post, and the United Brethren church. He served in World War I with the U.S. Artillery in France. Until this year "Doc" Troutman had been responsible for the elaborate decorations for the annual Masonic Christmas party for a number of years a fine deed by which he will long be remembered.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Lucy Troutman; two daughters, Elnora and Juanita Troutman at home; his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Henry Troutman of Dayton; a brother, Carl Troutman, of Dayton; two sisters, Mrs. Howard Bowser of New Lebanon and Mrs. Bomer Leis of Farmersville.

Burial will be in Otterbein Cemetery by K.R. Fichner.
